Dear Friends,

A new kind of hope?

As I write this I think of things I have never done on my birthday before, such as writing a pastoral letter. It's easy to think of the things I cannot do, such as the traditional going out for a meal with friends and family. However, staying in has its benefits. My daughter has baked an amazing cake and my wife is cooking a lovely birthday meal (omelette and chips, in case anyone asks). These are a couple of the many upsides to being in lockdown. Others are that friends and strangers have more time to chat, albeit from across the road. The other evening I took our dog out for what felt like an apocalyptic walk; not a single person to be seen, a strange hush that I have never felt before, only a few birds chirping in the distance to break the silence. The sound of an approaching car seemed to go on forever before it drove past. They say that when things get back to normal, it won't be the same kind of normal.

The initial response to a crisis; panic, seems to have abated somewhat as the shops restock with toilet rolls and other essentials. Shopping is a new, strange, experience; having to queue to get both in and out of the supermarket. I visited one supermarket and everyone wore a mask. I visited another and no one wore a mask. I have no idea why. I would recommend using the village shop, if you can. They seem to be better stocked, and if you don't have to drive there's a double bonus.

I find it interesting the way society responds to experts. They have been studying climate change for many years. It's real and it's happening now, although mainly somewhere else, so maybe that's why most of us slept peacefully at night. Until the floods came, and took many houses and cars (including ours). We had the floods.

Australia had the fires and then somewhere in between, the virus started. It's new, it's unknown, it's never happened before and yet we listen to every word the experts tell us. Why? We don't have a choice; it's a matter of life and death. Originally we were told the old and the infirm were most at risk, but

A message in light of Coronavirus (COVID 19).

We have all seen and heard much in the news recently about the spread of Coronavirus and the impact this is having on individuals and communities. As I sit and write this we are working to formulate contingency plans for our churches, and there are more uncertainties and unanswered

questions than there are answers. This uncertainty has led to worry, and fear for many people.

In the midst of this fear and uncertainty our faith in God offers us hope. Jesus gives us the reassurance of his presence with us at all times saying; ***“remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.”*** (Matthew 28:20) It is often said that the Bible tells us to not be afraid, or not to fear, 365 times, once for every day of the year. The prophet Isaiah recorded God's words, ***“Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour.”*** (Isaiah 43:1-3) Whilst it is natural to be fearful when we read our newspapers or watch the TV news bulletins, it is reassuring to know that no matter what is happening in our world, despite our concerns over Coronavirus, and in times of adversity and sickness, God is there with us, walking alongside us, and offering us the comfort of his redeeming love and saving grace. As we face Coronavirus it is good to remember the words of St Paul ***“Nothing can ever separate us from God's love. Neither [...] our fears for today nor our worries about tomorrow [...] indeed, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord.”*** (Romans 8:38-39)

Whilst we have seen some selfish and irresponsible behaviour in response to this situation, such as the panic buying of household products and some food stuffs, I have been encouraged by the many generous and positive steps that people have taken. Neighbours have been looking out for one another, notes have been put through doors offering help if it is needed, communities are coming together to ensure that the most vulnerable members of society are cared for and supported through this situation. Jesus constantly reminded us of the need to ***“love one another”*** or to ***“love your neighbour as yourself”*** (John 13:35, Mark12:31), and his message of care and concern for the sick, the vulnerable and the suffering is as important as ever in light of this pandemic. It is heart-warming to see so many people putting their Christian faith into action and caring for their neighbours at this difficult time.

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York have written to all clergy regarding Coronavirus, in their letter they said...

We want to assure you all of our prayers and thoughts as across the country, communities consider what steps they can take to care and support one another. [...] May we also pray for all those working in our health service and in leadership roles. We are grateful for their dedication, expertise and hard work. As we journey

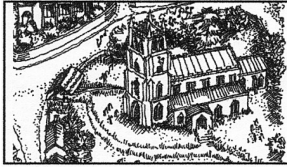

Our school motto is now more relevant than it ever was. We are certainly in changing and unprecedented times. Our thoughts and prayers are with the children, parents, carers and families at this time.

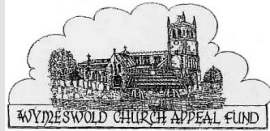

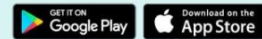
Once again "Thank You" to everyone who has supported WCAF over the years and we hope to have a full programme of events in 2021.

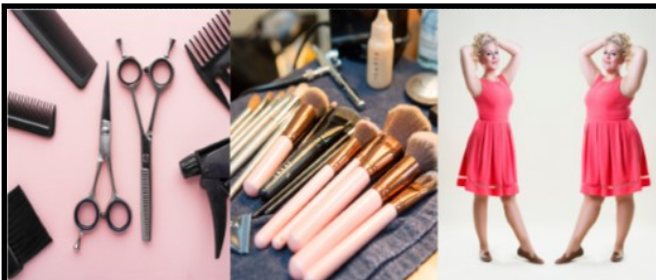

Since then things haven't gone to plan - the bad weather put a stop to our snowdrop outing, originally set for February at Belton House in Lincolnshire. Then came news of Covid 19 - should we continue with our talk in March by Griselda Kerr of the Dower House at Melbourne? To be on the safe side we postponed the talk. The "Bee Lady", Sandra Hart, was due to talk to us on April 23rd but as things are getting worse

we have postponed her talk too.


Our "big outing," the weekend coach trip to see gardens in Yorkshire has also had to be postponed, but there is a light on the horizon! 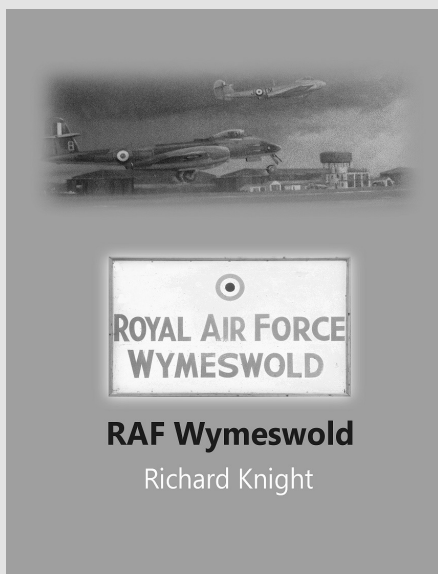

£50 million support package for Charnwood businesses leaps into action

More than £5 million of government funding is on its way to Charnwood businesses as part of a £50 million package to help local firms.

Charnwood Borough Council has acted quickly to get the first set of government business grants to local companies who are struggling because of the coronavirus pandemic. More firms will receive millions of pounds of support in the coming weeks.

On the day the council launched its online registration form (Wednesday, April 1), 539 businesses registered for grants and 222 payments worth a total of £15.5 million were processed that day or within the next week. Some applications require further checks or information and are being carried out as a priority.

The Council estimates 2,700 businesses in the borough will be eligible for the grants worth a combined total of £32million.

It comes as the Council also informs 850 businesses in the borough this week that they qualify for a business rates relief holiday and therefore will not pay rates for a year. That will save the 850 businesses over £18 million in business rates.

Combined with the grants, the available support to borough businesses is worth around £50 million.

In total, between the grants and the business rates holidays, we estimate that package of support will be around £50 million in Charnwood alone. Grants of either £10,000 or £25,000 are available to businesses that already get rate relief or are in sectors most affected by the national lockdown – such as shops, restaurants, gyms, beauticians and estate agents.

In order to claim the grant payment, a business needs to fill in an online registration form on the Council website. It does not take long to complete and will help ensure that payments only go to those businesses that are eligible and in most need.

The Council has also deployed extra staff to help process the payments and deal with queries about the grants and other business rates matters during the COVID-19 crisis. However, the Council has been experiencing a high volume of calls so people are encouraged to visit the Council website in the first instance www.charnwood.gov.uk/cvbusiness or email business.rates@charnwood.gov.uk.

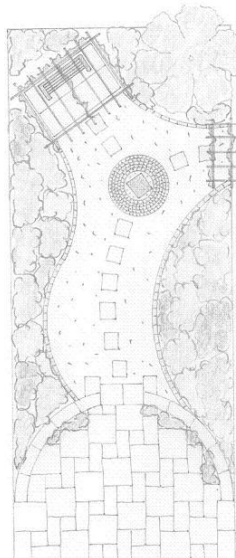

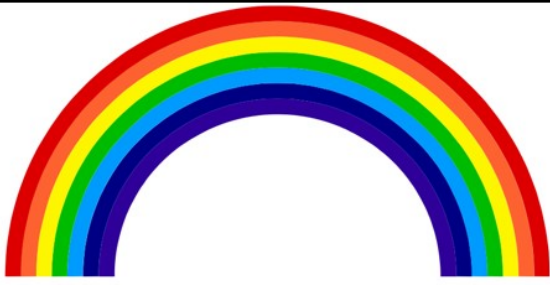
